Please understand that all SCCCFF funds are provided by the generous donors (individuals and businesses) of this community who support our work!

SCCCFF policy prohibits us from approving requests for payment of medical services provided by Aurora Sheboygan Memorial Medical Center, St. Nicholas Hospital, Aurora Vince Lombardi Cancer Clinic, Matthews Oncology Associates or Sheboygan Cancer & Blood Specialists for the following reasons:

- 1) Each of these organizations has their own mechanisms in place to assist patients with their financial obligations.
- 2) Representatives from these organizations are active with SCCCFF and, thus, such payments could be construed as a conflict of interest.
